Everyone has a story. Do you know an amazing story about a neighbor? We'd love to hear from you, and we promise not to mention any names.


MAY DAY BASKET WINNERS

New Beijing Kitchen's secret for their busy service business is not only linked to their varied menu but also to the tasty and fresh ingredients that are used. Combine great tasting food with prices that are reasonable, and you have a successful business. RECIPE

Easy Lemon Cake

From the kitchen of Dorthea Turek

1 pkg. (2 layer size) lemon cake mix 2 pkg. (3.4 oz. each) Jello lemon instant pudding 1½ cups cold milk 1 tub (8 oz.) Cool Whip topping (thawed)

Prepare cake mix as directed for two 9-inch round cake layers. Let cool completely.

Beat pudding mix and milk with whisk until thick.

Spread over tops of cake layers. Stack cake layers. Frost with Cool Whip. Keep Refrigerated.

Variation: Prepare cake mix for 13x9 inch pan. Let cool completely. Layer pudding then cool whip. Sometimes I cut the amount of pudding, using only 1 box with 3/4 cup milk. I also add the zest of one lemon and its juice to the cake mix. (The lemon is part of the liquid added to the cake.)




