
This includes any planting you may want to do around the green utility boxes. However, you need not fill out a form if you are adding annuals to your garden.





GAZEBO and VEGETABLE GARDENS

The call for a weeding party on June 15 to clean up the **Gazebo Garden** was well answered. Ten gardeners came out and all 20 beds were worked, resulting in a dozen plastic bags of weeds which were collected and disposed of. Dennis authorized us to buy mulch by the bag for our beds, and Steve Guy bought 10 bags of hardwood mulch, which were quickly spread over the garden. The well-worn American flags were sent to the Legion to be properly burned. New flags were purchased and strategically placed throughout the 20 beds. The garden overall was looking pretty good for the Fourth of July celebration.

The martin house has been well occupied, and the second brood of chicks is under way. Since the martins were late in arriving, it is hoped they will stay a little longer this year;

but if they are true to form, they will leave around August 15. The killdeer which normally nest in the Gazebo area, have abandoned us this year. They have nested in front of the Clubhouse and in the outdoor pool area. We did have a nest of mockingbirds in the Gazebo Garden.

I'm sure you all have noted the large amount of rain in June, which set a record. The corn loves it – it is as high as an elephant's eye – as the song goes. But it has not been great for our **Vegetable Garden**. We usually have lots of tomatoes by July 4, but the rain has kept them from ripening. The same goes for the squash. The lettuce and other greens were pretty good,



but the deer and the numerous rabbits have decimated them. We are fattening them up for the fall rabbit season. In spite of all this, we expect the warm dry weather to give us a large tomato harvest.



NEIGHBORHOOD NEWS

BRUSH/YARD WASTE PICK UP



The Town of Centreville provides brush and yard waste pick-up to the residents of the town. To ensure the Town picks up your yard waste, please make sure the following guidelines are met:

- 1. Brush/yard waste consists <u>only</u> of trees, limbs, branches, leaves, and grass clippings.
- 2. All yard waste should be placed curbside (not in the roadway) by 6 a.m. Mondays. Public Works crews will pick up yard waste as early in the week as practical, but priority is given to maintenance of water and wastewater pipes and other critical functions.
- 3. No limbs or branches shall be placed for collection exceeding more than 40 pounds per piece or bundle. Limbs shorter than one foot in length must be placed in a container for collection.
- 4. Limbs or branches exceeding 4 inches in diameter and 50 pounds will **<u>not</u>** be collected and must be disposed of by the property owner.
- 5. All leaves or grass clippings for collection must be placed in baskets, cans, or containers and shall not exceed 50 pounds per container. Any container over 50 pounds will **not** be collected.
- 6. Amounts larger than a small pickup truck load (50 cubic feet) will **not** be collected by the town.

RESTAURANT REVIEW



Market Street Public House

The discovery of the Market Street Public House began when we wanted to stop in Denton for lunch. This Irish Pub is located on the corner directly across from the County Court House and is open for lunch and dinner. In the summer, there are tables outside or you can go inside. Inside you can sit at the bar or at one of the many tables along the long shotgun-style restaurant. The décor is definitely Irish.


There was a choice of draft beers (of course Guinness, Harp, and Smithwicks) as well other typical bar drinks. On Sundays, there are \$3 Bloody Marys and mimosas.

The menu has many modern dishes as well as typical Irish dishes such as Shepherd's Pie, Guinness Irish Stew, and Fish and Chips. Recently, I savored the Honey Ham and Brie wrap which included green apples along with the ham and melted Brie. Larry relished the Pub's Famous Corned Beef Reuben. Both were served with lots of thinly hand-cut fries and Cole Slaw. I asked the neighboring table to tell me how they enjoyed their meal. One lady said she comes here every week and loves the cream of crab soup. On this occasion, she said she really enjoyed the Dublin Mexi-Cali Wrap which was a tomato wrap with chicken tenders, lettuce, tomato, jalapeno peppers, salsa, and ranch dressing.

From the waitress, we learned that the favorite desserts are the heaping dish of cinnamon apple crisp and the brownie ice cream sandwich (brownie, ice cream, whipped cream, and chocolate syrup). Larry and I will have to go back some time just for the dessert (no room this time).

The manager pointed out that there are special nights: Tuesdays are \$5 Hamburger Nights from 3 until 9, and Wednesdays are \$5 Burritos and Quesadillas Nights from 3 until 9. Monday is Trivia Night and Saturday is Karaoke.

2 cans shoepeg corn (drained)


3 peppers (red, green, yellow, and finely diced)
